Strength of Career Interests by Race/Ethnicity 2012



- 30% of White and 29% of Asian students are not sure what career they will pursue.
- Only 16% of African American students are not sure what career they will pursue.

Among ACT-tested 2012 high school graduates, African American and Hispanic students are more certain of their career intentions than are White and Asian students. African American students have particularly strong career intentions—45% of African American graduates are very sure of their career choice.

Note: Data are from 1,448,045 ACT-tested 2012 high school graduates. Approximately 4 percent did not indicate strength of their career choice.
