Strength of Career Interests by Race/Ethnicity 2013



- 29% of White and 28% of Asian high school students are not sure what career they will pursue.
- Only 16% of African American high school students are not sure what career they will pursue.

Among ACT-tested 2013 high school graduates, African American and Hispanic students are more certain of their career intentions than White and Asian Students.¹ African American students have particularly strong career intentions – 45% of African American students in the Class of 2013 indicated that they are "very sure" of their career choice.
