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ACT Performance for Students with Disabilities who Tested with Accommodations in 2014

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Students with documented disabilities may take the ACT® test with test accommodations in accordance with the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA). Examples of test accommodations include a large type test booklet, extended time, and alternate test formats, including Braille, DVDs, or a reader

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


Figure 1. Average ACT Composite Score by Disability Type Compared to the Population of ACT-tested High School Graduates of 2014

Key Takeaways

- On average, with a few exceptions, students who tested with accommodations earned lower scores than did students from the population of all ACT-tested high school graduates of 2014.
- On average, students with motor impairments and psychiatric disorders (e.g., mood or anxiety) scored as well as or better than the average score for the population of ACT-tested high school graduates of 2014.
- Students with learning disabilities tended to score lower on average than did students with other types of disabilities.
